NC Mission Trip Report

This summer, the Carolina Baptist Association team embarked on a mission trip to North Carolina to do Disaster Relief at the Rebuild Center in Spruce Pine, NC. The area had been devastated by Hurricane Helene on September 27, 2024, leaving destruction and loss in Asheville, Spruce Pine, Chimney Rock, Lake Lure, Burnsville, and many surrounding

communities. Guided by faith and a desire to serve, our team arrived ready to help wherever we were needed.

From the very first day, everyone jumped in with energy and purpose. The ladies worked alongside Ms. Linda and Ms. Shelley—painting, preparing showers, organizing supplies, and handling many small but important tasks that made a big difference for the local team. The men focused on finishing a new deck for a pastor, learning new skills and forming strong bonds with other volunteers.

One unforgettable moment happened while the team was working at a campground that had flooded the previous September. Eight men, sensing God's leading, carried 300 feet of maritime rope and used it to rescue forty people trapped on RVs and other dangerous spots during the storm. Even though they had known rain was coming, they could not have anticipated the lives they would save. This was a true example of divine intervention and God's perfect timing.

Each day brought new opportunities to serve. The ladies spent time trimming and cleaning the yard for a gracious woman in her 90s, making sure everything was neat and bagged. The men continued work at the campground, partnering with other groups and building meaningful relationships. Later, the ladies joined them so the entire team could work side by side—a time that was both productive and uplifting.

In between the hard work, the team also enjoyed moments of fellowship and fun. Meals were a joy, filled with great food and laughter, and the opportunity to meet other volunteers from different groups made the experience even richer. These moments of connection, shared stories, and lighthearted fun helped everyone recharge and strengthened the sense of community on the trip.

Another highlight was building a wheelchair ramp for a gentleman on hospice, giving him safe access in and out of his home. The women learned to use drills and tools while the men patiently guided and encouraged them. The joy on the family's faces and the prayers shared made every moment worthwhile. Even when a day ended early, the team sought out more ways to serve—building a small back porch for a woman in need.

During downtime, we gathered to share experiences from each day and reflect on how the trip had changed our perspectives. Life can change in a moment, and hearing everyone's stories reminded us of God's presence in every step we take. These moments, full of laughter, reflection, and encouragement, will stay with us forever.

Throughout the week, we were blessed by powerful testimonies. Ms. Linda shared how God had brought her through challenges stronger than ever, and Chris testified to overcoming a

30-year habit through God's power. These moments reminded everyone that while we were rebuilding homes, God was also rebuilding hearts and lives—including our own.

This mission trip was more than a week of physical labor—it was a week of spiritual renewal, divine appointments, fellowship, and seeing God at work in ways beyond our understanding. We returned home tired in body but full of faith, gratitude, and joy, knowing we had been part of something far greater than ourselves.

We would like to extend our deepest thanks to everyone who supported this mission trip. If you prayed for us, donated, or gave financially to make this possible—thank you, thank you from the bottom of our hearts. Your support not only helped rebuild homes, but it also allowed us to share the love of Christ and witness His power in amazing ways.

A number of our churches are benefiting from their services and many individuals (including Jackie and me) are extremely appreciative of the fine services they provide for us personally.

Here's a snapshot of the services they provide:

- Investments tailored for churches we work with churches to help them think about the purposes of the excess (or earmarked, cemetery, scholarship...) funds God has entrusted to them and develop a strategy for investment. Our investment offerings are tailored for churches and we have investment options for short-term investing (such as building funds) and long-term investing (cemetery or contingency funds). In many cases, such as a cemetery fund, we help churches develop a strategy to produce annual income for future needs. We also offer CD-type instruments for churches that are more conservative in their investment mindsets.
- Lending we offer lending services for SC Southern Baptist churches. Our lending
 ministry is truly a ministry and we spend a lot of time consulting with churches,
 regardless of whether they use us as their lender. We like to work with committees as
 early as possible so that they can understand what they can reasonably afford. (It's
 always good to know what you can afford before talking to the architect.)
- Capital Campaigns through our campaign services, we can help churches with a customized strategy for raising funds.
- **Generosity** we provide "legacy" talks to help church members consider ways to give to their churches both today and tomorrow. As you are aware, we provide estate planning services to help families with their personal planning for their loved ones and the Lord's work.

Our services are shared through a biblical lens. Our goal is to help God's people understand how God has provided resources so that Kingdom work can be advanced. When we follow His vision and are faithful with His resources, He gets the glory.
